(GAT), which is a 45 minutes test on the pattern of CAT exam for Management PG Aspirants. The candidate will be exempted from GAT in case he/she has given any of the listed tests.

Group Discussion (GD)

Candidates who have obtained a qualifying score in GAT, CMAT, CAT, XAT & MAT are invited to participate in the Group Discussion process, which may be conducted on campus or in virtual mode. The topic for discussion is provided by the panelist(s).

The Group Discussion is evaluated based on predefined scoring parameters. The GD panel comprises a minimum of two evaluators. In addition to participating in the discussion, candidates are required to write an essay of 500–700 words on the GD topic.

Based on performance in the Group Discussion, candidates are shortlisted to appear for the Personal Interview.

Personal Interview (PI)

All candidates appearing in the GD/PI process are invited to participate in the Personal Interview. The interview is conducted by a panel consisting of a minimum of two panelists. The Personal Interview may be conducted in online or offline mode, depending on prevailing circumstances.

There is no separate quota or fixed number of seats earmarked for candidates qualifying through specific entrance examinations such as AIEEE, State CET, University-level tests, CMAT, GPAT, or Association-conducted tests. The admission criteria are designed to provide equal opportunity to candidates from all academic streams and from any recognized entrance test. Admissions are granted purely on merit and eligibility as per institute norms.

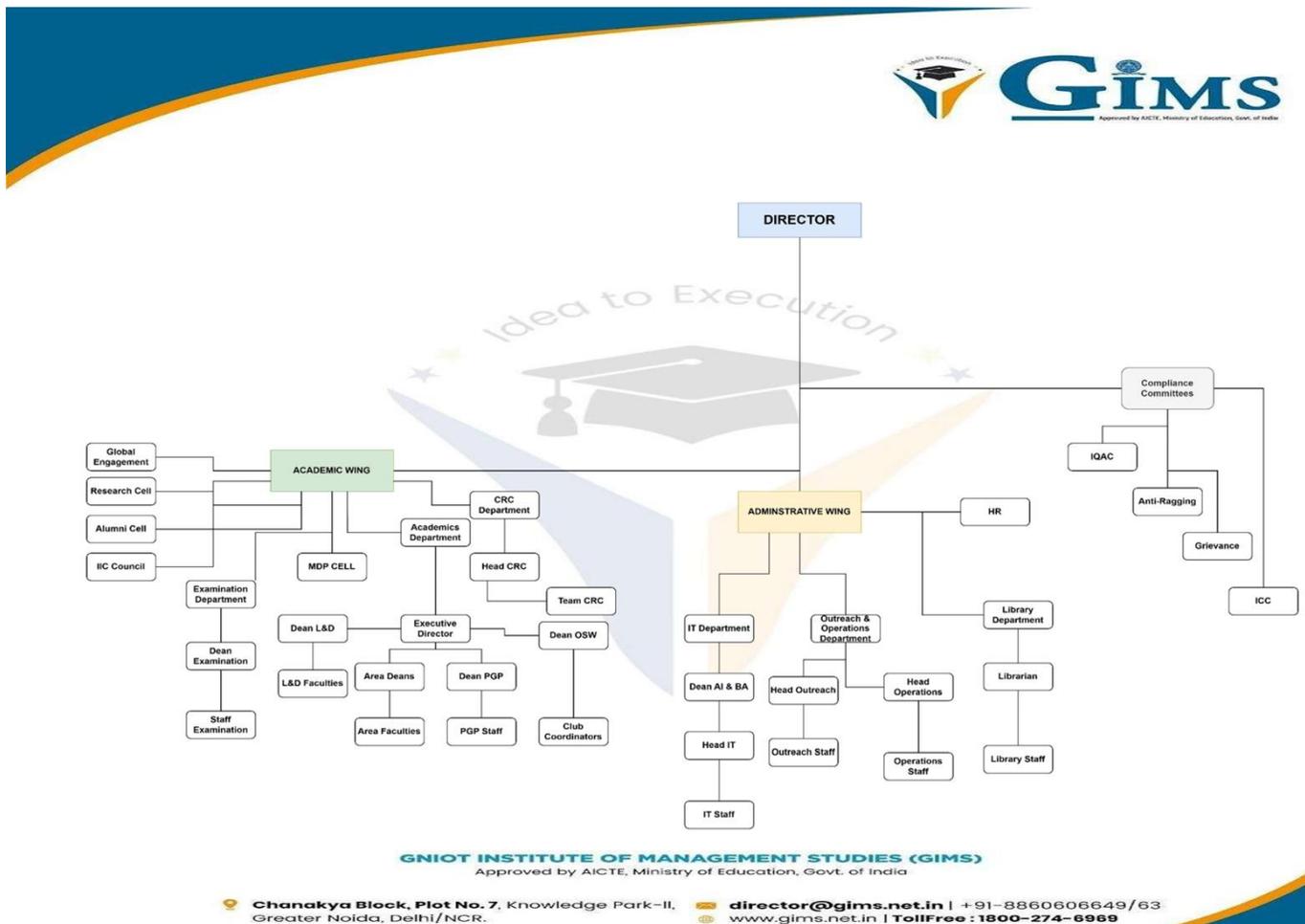
